YEAR 6 STAFF:

INFORMATION NIGHT:

Thursday 23rd February, 6:00pm – 6:45pm. <u>This will be an online session</u>. You will receive further information about how to access this event shortly. This is a highly important session, as we will be discussing your child's transition to secondary school, graduation, camps, and expectations for the year.

HUMANITIES:

Our Term 1 Humanities unit is *Making Democracy*. Students will examine the different levels of government and how important decisions are made. A highlight of this unit is our mock election – who will be named Prime Minister?

LIVING AND GROWING PROGRAM:

YEAR 6 **LEADERSHIP PROGRAM**:

All of our Year 6 students will take part in a Leadership Program to be held in February & March. There will be a COMPASS note regarding the cost and consent for this program.

COMMUNICATION:

We encourage families to keep in touch with us using the following methods. **Staff Email Accounts** –

We will once again offer teacher email as a major component of communication between school and home. This year the email addresses have changed slightly, please check below for the email address for your child's teacher. These email addresses were recently sent to all families via a Compass post.

Emails will be checked each day and, if required, a response given within 24 hours. If you have anything to tell us, an area of concern or would like to make a time to meet, email is your best way to contact us. Please note that if it is a timely or urgent matter, it would be best to call the school office and leave a message with the office staff.

Daily 8:50 start – You are welcome to drop in to the classrooms to speak with your child's teacher during the time before class begins each morning. This is the best option if the information is time-sensitive.

Diaries – Year 6 students will soon be provided with diaries, which you can also use to communicate with your child's teacher. However, your child must inform the teacher if there is any new communication. Otherwise, all diaries are checked each Thursday.

Should you require a longer face-to-face discussion with your child's teacher, please use one of the methods above to organise a time to speak with them. Please be aware, staff meetings are on Tuesday and Thursday evenings, so teachers may not be available at those times.

HOME READING:

Home reading should total at least 80 minutes throughout the week. We suggest that this is spread across at least three days. Please ensure children record their reading in their diaries or a reading log and that you have signed off next to each day your child has read.

HOMEWORK:

Homework is an important part of developing students' organisational skills in preparation for high school. Parents will be surveyed regarding the type of homework to be covered in Year 6 this year. Students should use their diaries to record all assignments and due dates. Parents will be contacted via Compass once this has been decided.

PARENT HELPERS:

If you are free to assist with any area throughout the week, your help is always greatly appreciated in the classroom. Please do not feel that because your child is now in the senior years of primary school that your help is not wanted as we would love any assistance that you can offer. Excursions, sports days, community events, classroom activities are some of the activities with which you can assist. Please note that an up-to-date *Working with Children Check* is required.

ABSENCES:

We have discussed with our classes the importance of regularly attending school, unless they are unwell. A high attendance rate will ensure your child makes the most of their learning. We require all parents to explain student absences by logging these online using COMPASS. Should you require further assistance, please see the Office staff. Please do not send a paper note to your child's teacher.

YEAR 6 CAMP:

This year the Year 6 Camp will be a 3-day camp at Weekaway in Lancefield, a camp site we have used for many years. This year the camp will be held during the last week of this term, from Monday 3rd April to Wednesday 5th April.

A separate COMPASS note regarding the costs for this camp will be sent home soon. If you have any questions regarding the camp please see Ms Ivanoff. If you would like to set up a payment plan please contact our school office staff, as we understand that Year 6 has a number of expenses this first term.

MATHS:

Upon reaching the senior years of primary school, in preparation for secondary school, students are exposed to a wide range of mathematical experiences and content. At this level of schooling, we aim for children to already have a firm grasp of their number facts, particularly multiplication/division tables. Rapid recall of these facts will make a significant difference in your child's ability to cope with the demands that come with mathematics in year 6. We encourage all students to revise their tables regularly at home in order to support more complex learning in the classroom.
